Changes to Weed Seed Order: Questions and Answers on Weed Seeds

Order, 2016 – The Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) has posted a series of questions and answers to its website regarding the *Weed Seeds Order* (WSO), 2016. The WSO is a ministerial order made under the *Seeds Act* and plays a critical role in preventing the introduction of new weed species into Canada by preventing or limiting the presence of weed species in seed sold in Canada.
