Now that Fusarium is in most parts of the province, it's time to ensure all our customers know how to combat the disease.

What we can do:

 Submit seed samples to labs: Seed testing is an important tool to ensure farmers know the quality of their seed, and to plan for an appropriate seed treatment.

SAFETY TRAINING:

Shoulda- Woulda- Coulda.

Many plants have the intention of implementing their safety management system, but few actually have taken the time to do so. To be compliant with federal OH&S code, Seed Plants must have an up to date safety management system, which also includes at least one staff member trained in emergency first aid.

. With the goal of starting the process of having a working safety management system, managers & staff from 9 plants in southern Alberta participated in a one-day safety training day held in Lethbridge.



Topics covered were Hazard Assessment, Emergency Response, Working Alone and Fall Protection. In addition to the training many of the plants plan on sending at least one of their staff to get emergency first aid certification, which is offered by St. John's Ambulance and other education providers in locations across Alberta.

Safety training will be a component of this year's AGM training session. It is important for directors to understand their responsibility in having policies that relate to the safe operation of all seed/grain processing activities.
